Solessence 7 Villages Extra Brut NV

The NV Extra Brut Solessence 7 Villages is generous in the glass, with lovely depth and creaminess at this level. Dried pear, candied lemon peel, marzipan and dried flowers develop in the glass, but it is the wine's overall balance that is especially impressive. This is a lovely NV wine from Sélèque. Dosage is 3 grams per liter. Disgorged: April 2017.

A blend of 50 per cent 2015 and 50 per cent reserve wine, this has a very attractive, expressive, fruit-focused nose, showing white peaches and light, approachable berries and flowers. The palate is very crisp with very bright acidity and is dry (3g dosage). Gently grippy and fresh, complete palate. Drink now whilst fresh.

Jean-Marc Sélèque's current release of his "Solessence" non-vintage Extra Brut is marked as "Lot 2015".... The bouquet is pure and flat out stunning, jumping from the glass in a mix of pear, apple, a touch of buttery oak, almond paste, a complex mosaic of chalky soil tones and a delicate topnote of fresh nutmeg. On the palate the wine is bright, fullbodied, focused and rock solid at the core... This is stellar non-vintage Extra Brut!

Solessence Rosé 7 Villages Extra Brut NV

This smells of pink grapefruit and pomegranate with bright, chalky minerals. The palate is very opulent, super vinous with mouth-filling, light strawberry and watermelon. Mineral finish. This is made using the Solessence blend, to which is added ten per cent pinot-meunier juice after two days of maceration and five per cent red pinot noir. Each of these components is actually made and released as a wine in their own right.
