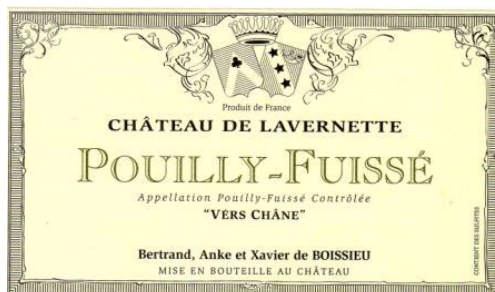


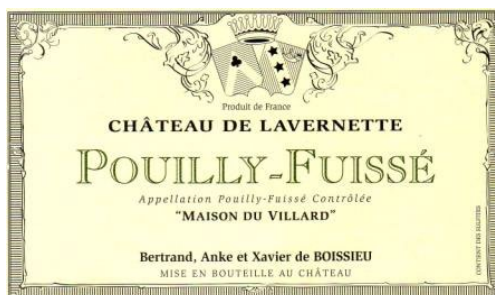
Château de Lavernette Beaujolais



Pouilly-Fuissé “Vers Chêne” 2019

Scents of honey, freshly baked bread, confit citrus and buttery pastry introduce the 2019 Pouilly-Fuissé Vers Chêne, a medium to full-bodied, ample and satiny wine with lively acids and a mouthwatering finish.

Pouilly-Fuissé “Maison du Villard” 2021

As I have mentioned in the past, the Maison du Villard bottling of Pouilly-Fuissé from Château de Lavernette is their old vine cuvée, made from very old chardonnay vines planted in the village of Chaintré. The vines were planted in four tranches, in 1959, 1964, 1970 and 1971! The wine is fermented and raised entirely in stainless steel and the 2021 version delivers a refined aromatic constellation of apple, fresh apricot, almond, lovely chalky soil tones, apple blossoms and honeysuckle. On the palate the wine is bright, full-bodied, focused and zesty, with outstanding depth at the core, superb soil signature and grip, bouncy acids and a very long, complex and seamlessly balanced finish. This is outstanding juice!
