

## DOMAINE DE LA FOLIE RULLY 1ER CRU CLOS DU CHAIGNE

Folie sits on the crown of the Montagne de la Folie, occupying the northernmost zone of the Rully appellation and its highest elevations. Moreover, all but one of the domaine's vineyards are *monopoles*, which is all but unheard of along the Côte. It has been in Clémence Durelle's family for three centuries and since 2010, when she assumed the reins, completely reinvigorated.



## **VINEYARD**

Site: An enclosed vineyard that faces due east high up on a steep

slope, overlooking an ancient pilgrimage Camino route to

Cluny and thence to Santiago.

**Soil:** Clay-limestone.

**Vines:** Eight acres of vines planted in 1971. No herbicides or pesticides.

Varieties: Chardonnay.

## **CELLAR**

Vinification Manual harvest in small cases. Long, slow pressing and no S02

& Aging: additions prior to vinification. Depending on the year, the wine

is between 80-100% in wood, of which 15-20% is new while the

rest of the barrels have seen 1-5 cycles of élevage.

**Production:** 4,400 six-pack cases.

Profile: Decidedly classical with fresh fruit and clear minerality. Its

elevation makes for a racy, long wine.
