

# DOMAINE DE LA FOLIE BOURGOGNE ALIGOTÉ

Folie sits on the crown of the Montagne de la Folie, occupying the northernmost zone of the Rully appellation and its highest elevations. Moreover, all but one of the domaine's vineyards are *monopoles*, which is all but unheard of along the Côte. It has been in Clémence Durelle's family for three centuries and since 2010, when she assumed the reins, completely reinvigorated.



### **VINEYARD**

Site: The Folie Mountain lines the eastern side of the Bouzeron

hollow, famous for Aligoté. Were Clémence a ball player, she could practically throw a baseball from the Aligoté vineyard down over the hill into Bouzeron. Folie's vines grow in the Clos

la Folie vineyard.

Soil: Clay-limestone.

**Vines:** From two parcels just under 2 acres; the larger parcel was

planted in 1947 and the smaller one in 1973. North-northeast

exposure. No herbicides or pesticides.

Varieties: Aligoté.

### **CELLAR**

Vinification No wood here-raised entirely in tank. No SO2 additions during

& Aging: vinification and aging.

**Production:** 8,000 six-pack cases.

**Profile:** Decidedly classical with fresh fruit and clear minerality.



## DOMAINE DE LA FOLIE RULLY CLOS LA FOLIE

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### **VINEYARD**

Site: A walled vineyard with parcels of Aligoté, Chardonnay, cassis

and two rows of fruit trees occupying the northeast-facing slope in front of the domaine's house. As the crow flies,

Puligny-Montrachet is just over 3 miles away.

Soil: Clay-limestone.

**Vines:** 4.7 acres of vines planted in 1972. No herbicides or pesticides.

Varieties: Chardonnay.

### **CELLAR**

Vinification Raised entirely in tank. No SO2 additions during fermentation

& Aging: or aging.

**Production:** 2,000 six-pack cases.

**Profile:** Decidedly classical with fresh fruit and clear minerality. Elegant,

lean and stony.



# DOMAINE DE LA FOLIE RULLY 1ER CRU CLOS DU CHAIGNE

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### **VINEYARD**

Site: An enclosed vineyard that faces due east high up on a steep

slope, overlooking an ancient pilgrimage Camino route to

Cluny and thence to Santiago.

**Soil:** Clay-limestone.

**Vines:** Eight acres of vines planted in 1971. No herbicides or pesticides.

Varieties: Chardonnay.

### **CELLAR**

Vinification Manual harvest in small cases. Long, slow pressing and no S02

& Aging: additions prior to vinification. Depending on the year, the wine

is between 80-100% in wood, of which 15-20% is new while the

rest of the barrels have seen 1-5 cycles of élevage.

**Production:** 4,400 six-pack cases.

Profile: Decidedly classical with fresh fruit and clear minerality. Its

elevation makes for a racy, long wine.



## DOMAINE DE LA FOLIE RULLY CLOS DE BELLECROIX

Folie sits on the crown of the Montagne de la Folie, occupying the northernmost zone of the Rully appellation and its highest elevations. Moreover, all but one of the domaine's vineyards are *monopoles*, which is all but unheard of along the Côte. It has been in Clémence Durelle's family for three centuries and since 2010, when she assumed the reins, completely reinvigorated.



## **VINEYARD**

Site: On the hillside sloping down to the town of Chagny.

**Soil:** Clay-limestone.

Vines: 11.8 acres of vines planted in 1962. North-northeastern

exposure. Hand harvested. No herbicides or pesticides.

Varieties: Pinot Noir.

#### **CELLAR**

Vinification Most of the grapes are destemmed. Made with light punch

& Aging: downs and raised in tank.

**Production:** 3,000 six-pack cases.

**Profile:** The domaine's bistro red. Fresh and crisp, with tantalizing fruit

and elegant structure.
