Composed and well-integrated nose with massive extract and interest. Positively hums with life; you can almost sense bees humming in the wine – metaphorically of course! Pure fruit and real depth. Great weight on the palate despite the relatively low alcohol. Great food wine. Very long indeed. This should last and last.

The bouquet jumps from the glass in a youthful blend of lime peel, tart orange, a nice touch of wild yeasts, botanicals, a beautifully complex base of slate, a hint of menthol and a lovely topnote of citrus zest. On the palate the wine is pure, full-bodied and youthful, with a rock-solid core, excellent mineral drive and cut, snappy acids and lovely focus and grip on the long, vibrant and very promising finish. This will demand some cellar time to really open up and start drinking with generosity. It has enormous potential. 2027-2075.

Quite deep honeyed straw colour. Miraculously pungent and concentrated. This is as like a traditional Mosel Riesling as an Amontillado sherry is. Such concentration and extract! But not obvious alcohol. The slaty slope and nothing but the slaty slope. Enjoy Sybille's story in the new film about women in wine. There is sheer hard work in this wine. Floral and mineral tincture. For food – or you could just sip it and marvel at what well-tended biodynamic Riesling can do.
